

**Parent Participation in State and Federal Remedial Programs**

For federal and state funded programs for low income and low performing students, parents are provided opportunities to participate in the design and implementation of the programs. The parent participation includes:

- A. at least one public meeting to which parents of eligible students are invited to explain the programs and activities provided with federal and state funds. At the meeting parents will be informed of their rights to
  - 1. consult in the design,
  - 2. provide input on the implementation, and
  - 3. establish ongoing communication among parents, teachers and state or federal agency officials;
- B. notification that a child qualified for service;
- C. reporting of instructional objectives annually and progress toward meeting the objectives at least three times yearly;
- D. providing workshops and/or materials to parents to help children at home on basic skills;
- E. yearly survey of all parents to gather suggestions for future improvements of the programs; and
- F. parent representation on the Financial Advisory Council, a staff/parent committee which reviews the program applications prior to school board review.
