

Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome (AIDS)

Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome (*AIDS*) is a serious disease caused by a virus that destroys a person's defenses against infections. The AIDS virus, known as the human immunodeficiency virus, or HIV, can so weaken a person's immune system that he or she becomes extremely susceptible to certain opportunistic infections and certain rare malignancies.

The district recognizes the seriousness of the AIDS virus and will comply with all current recommendations and regulations promulgated by the State Board of Health, including amendments thereto in the future.

The board authorizes the superintendent to adopt regulations consistent with the State Board of Health recommendations and regulations regarding students infected with the AIDS virus.
