

Emergency Treatment

When a student is injured it is the responsibility of the teacher or employees to see that immediate care and attention is given the injured party until relieved by an administrator, a nurse, an employee with first aid training, or an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT). Word of the accident should be sent to the school's building's main office. The principal or designated personnel should immediately contact 911, the parent, or both.

If the parent or EMT deems that further medical care is required, the student will be transported to the nearest medical facility. Cost of emergency transportation and/or treatment shall be the responsibility of the student's parent(s)/guardian(s).

Following any injury accident, a written report (see 3431 F) shall be completed and submitted to the district's Risk Manager.
