Credit: .5 Career & Technical Ed.
Location: Liberty High School

In this class we will cover a variety of cooking techniques ranging from soups, sauces, salads & entrees to baking & pastry. We will cover herbs & spices and flavor matching, plating design, service presentation and cuisines from around the world. Upon completion of this class students will have the basic skills necessary to prepare a complete multi-course meal for family or friends along with the confidence and ability to apply for an entry level restaurant job!

PE/Food & Fitness

Credit: .5 Physical Education
Location: Issaquah High School

General Description: This Food & Fitness PE course provides opportunities for students to develop and improve skills to participate successfully in a variety of lifelong physical fitness activities. Students will also gain knowledge in nutrition and be able to prepare basic healthy snacks and meals.

Content: Fitness and Nutrition, Basic cooking skills to prepare healthy snacks and meals, goal setting, creating personal fitness plans with monitoring through fitness testing, Yoga, weight training & plyometrics training, individual sports, and racquet sports. Team sports such as soccer, flag-football, volleyball, floor hockey and badminton.

Strategies: Students will learn through a combination of team sports, individual sports activities, group discussion and problem solving, fitness testing

Off campus components of this course will include Mount Si Golf Course 9-hole round and driving range (\$25/student); Boehm's Pool 2days/week (\$10/student), tennis courts at Tibbetts (walking), and bowling at Sun Villa Lanes in Bellevue.

Costs of the field trip are not a part of tuition and are additional fees to be paid by the student. **This course involves multiple off-campus sites. Transportation is not provided by the District. Parents are responsible for transportation.**

Credit: .5 Fine/Visual/Performing Arts*
Location: Skyline High School

General Description: Students learn art skills and the principles and elements of design. This course is appropriate for all students and serves as the prerequisite for Studio Art 2.

Content: Elements and principles of design using a variety of media; technical skills using a variety of media; some anatomy of human and other bodies

Strategies: Students will learn through a combination of: Hands-on projects, direct instruction and skill development
