

Issaquah School District: Equivalent Online Courses

ISD approved OSPI online learning courses are accepted in the Issaquah School District. In some cases, they may be taken for grade improvement or credit recovery following the procedures outlined in the high school course guide. It is important for a student to review the course selections with their counselor to confirm they fulfill the credit requirements of the student's particular situation. All registration is done through the Issaquah Online Learning Department. Students/parents are not to register directly with the provider(s). Except where noted the online provider used is Apex Learning.

Course	General Guideline
English	Must select English or Language Art grade level option for online, such as English 10.
Health	The Issaquah School District's online Health/CTE course will satisfy .5 Career and Technical Ed (CTE) graduation requirement and provide .5 health credit. The ISD online health is taught by Issaquah School District teachers and is not considered an outside credit. OSPI online health courses do <u>not</u> satisfy WA State Health Education requirements (summer 2015 and beyond).
Science	There are no ISD/OSPI online courses that will satisfy the requirement for Issaquah School District.
Math	Equivalent courses exist with the same titles.
Third Credit Math in place of Algebra II (does not meet baccalaureate college entrance requirement)	Liberal Arts Math Mathematics of Personal Finance
Pacific NW Studies	Washington State History (Fuel Education)
PE and Art	Select courses that meet objectives based on the situation.
US History	US History Core Semester 1 and Semester 2. AP US History also available.
World Language	Equivalent courses exist with the same titles.
World History and Civics	World History I: World History Sem 1 World History II: Modern World History from 1600 Sem 1 World History III: Modern World History from 1600 Sem 2 Civics: US Gov't Politics (AP available)
CTE	There are no ISD/OSPI approved online courses that will satisfy the CTE requirement for Issaquah School District. Online courses do not meet ISD Career and Technical Education requirements for CTE credit.
Tech Proficiency	There are no ISD/OSPI approved online courses that will satisfy the tech proficiency requirement.

Middle school students: May take high school level courses as long as they are not identified in our policy and/or course guide as being associated with a grade level. (i.e. English and Social Studies cannot be taken by a middle school student for high school credit because they are associated with high school grade levels 9-12.) Middle school students have until the junior year credit check to decide if they want to add the high school level online course to their transcript. A middle school level course is recorded on the middle school record at the time it is earned.

Middle school students enrolled in an online course during the scheduled school day, must take a year-long course or two semester courses due to semester/trimester scheduling factors.
