

Spartan Students and Families,

Please note the District is still actively bargaining with our IEA partners. Once an agreement is reached, ISD and IEA will release a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) detailing specifics of our hybrid learning model. Items in this document may be subject to change and yet we want our families to see our draft plans now for their own planning.

Our instructional model Skyline will be concurrent livestreaming. That means the teacher will teach in-person in the classroom. Part of the class will join the teacher in-person, while those not assigned to attend that day OR those who choose to continue remote learning will join at the same time by Zoom.

Whether or not your student will be returning to in-person learning, please review the following message carefully. It includes important information for those families whose students will begin attending in person. It also includes some information that will be relevant to those families whose students will continue learning remotely.

**Information for all Skyline Families (timeline for the coming day):**

In the coming days, Skyline HS families should expect the following:

- **March 30:** Families can access the [Hybrid Learning Schedule](#), the [Skyline Hybrid Handbook](#), and the District High School [FAQ](#). The Skyline Hybrid Handbook is subject to change, based on the contents of the MoU. The handbook contains specific guidelines and COVID mitigation protocols for Skyline, as well as information on arrival and dismissal procedures. Please review the handbook and this message. Both share valuable information to help your family prepare to begin in-person hybrid learning.
- **April 1:** Families can access bus routes here: <https://www.issaquah.wednet.edu/family/transportation/elink>
- **April 2:** Last full synchronous remote student day with current classroom configuration
- **April 5—9:** Spring Break
- **April 12, 13 and 14:** Teachers will post asynchronous learning for all students in Canvas while they prepare to be on site. Families should confirm that their students attended asynchronously for April 12—14 using [the District's attendance reporting form](#) on their student's school website.
- **April 15:** First day of in-person hybrid and concurrent livestreaming for high school students. Remote learning students will join in-person classmates on the **concurrent livestreaming schedule**.

**Information for families of students beginning in-person hybrid learning**

**COVID Safety Protocols:**

All students will be required to wear a face covering in order to attend school.

- If you believe your student needs an accommodation (through 504 or IEP process) because they are unable to wear a face covering please contact Will Buker ([bukerw@issaquah.wednet.edu](mailto:bukerw@issaquah.wednet.edu)) prior to Friday, April 2<sup>nd</sup>.
- Students will not be allowed in classrooms if they refuse to wear a face covering.

All parents/guardians or the student must complete a daily attestation prior to arriving at Skyline in order for their child to enter the building. Students will not be allowed to attend school without a completed attestation.

- Each school day, an email will be automatically sent to the contact designated as “Parent 1” in Skyward (for students with more than one family of record the message will only go to Parent 1). The email will contain a link to a form that asks whether students are experiencing COVID symptoms or have had exposure to COVID. Based on these responses, the form will indicate whether or not your student is cleared to attend school in-person that day.
- These emails will begin on Monday, April 12 to allow one day of practice for parents to learn and become comfortable with the process.
- After you receive your initial email, you may sign-up to also receive the daily attestation form by text message to a cell number of your choosing, this may be your student’s cell phone number.
- No visitors and/or volunteers will be allowed on campus.
